 - 1. Nob brought up the idea that Guts not be played at World Ultimate Championship.
 - (a) Reason to do this: Guts is not seen as a serious game; the affiliation with Ultimate takes something away from Ultimate.
 - (b) Reason not to: It may hurt the chances for survival of the sport of Guts in International play, with a couple of exceptions.
 - (c) Decision: Consult with Guts Committee to get their input in making a formal decision.
- E. World Club Ultimate Championships.
 - 1. Paul E. suggested that a bi-annual Club Championship be formalized, to be held in odd years; the first will be held next year in Germany in conjunction with Karlsruhe.

XXXXI. SPORT-AID

- A. Operation is set up to raise money for the benefit of the starving masses in Africa.
- B. Plan is to have a Disc Golf Tournament September 11, 1988 as a benefit.
- C. It was agreed that WFDF supports the concept and it seems that a number of tournaments have been scheduled.

 - °We hope that date can be changed to accomodate the World Games demonstration. Either to July 16th or July 31st.
 - ++We agreed to award the tournament to Charlie; we hope that date can be changed but, if it can't, it will still be held July 23-30, 1989.
- B. Ultimate: 1990
 - 1. Norway - Presentation given by Ose Boe.
 - 2. Canada - Presentation given by Chris Lowcock.
 - 3. UK - Bid withdrawn.

WORLD GAMES 1989

In 1989 the third World Games will be held from July 20th to July 30th in Karlsruhe, West Germany, a city of 280,000 inhabitants situated at the river Rhine some 80 miles south of Frankfurt close to the Black Forest and the French border. There will be sports such as Tumbling, Life Saving, Korfball and Body Building in the competition part, but since the WFDF has only recently become a member of the General Association of International Sports Federations (GAISF), it was too late to get disc sports involved as a competition event. Instead the Karlsruhe Organising Committee asked the Ultimate team of the Karlsruhe University to do a demonstration. A contract was signed in which the Organising Committee promises to provide a soccer field (no. 13 on the map) within the World Games area for the demos and to include our event in their public relations efforts. We will not receive any money or food or lodging for participants. The date is Tuesday, July 25th from 2.00 pm to 5.30 pm. My proposed program includes 2 hours of Ultimate and 90 minutes of single events. Torsten Görke is interested to comment and explain the demos at the field. I would like to have this proposal discussed by the WFDF Congress.

So far I am sure we can put up a decent demonstration with the help of German frisbee players. Certainly international participants would be a great help, but it is not sure if it is worthwhile inviting foreign (better) players. They would have to pay for their travel expenses and their stay. It is also not sure if the World Games and these exhibition sports will attract much publicity (public, media and officials). Thus we might spend lots of money and time only to end up on the last page of the local newspaper. But if some players are willing to take that risk they certainly are invited to help improve our exhibition.

The best way how to attract foreign players to Germany during the World Games is to have a big and important tournament in Germany. Then they would only have to spend very little extra money and time to attend the frisbee afternoon in Karlsruhe. Torsten Görke proposed a kind of Ultimate Club World Championship in Cologne, but he received very little feedback. Now, Torsten says, it has become a little late to set up a well organised tournament.

The Munich players are willing to run a large Golf Tournament in the Olympic Park in Munich. I have heard of plans of an Overall World Championship in Colchester, England.

I expect these suggestions will be discussed at the WFDF Congress and I hope this writing can give enough information to produce decisions without lengthy debates.
